Week of Solemnities and Feasts

This week we celebrate one Feast and two Solemnities. On August 24th we honor the Feast of St. Bartholomew, Apostle. On August 26th we observe the Solemnity of Our Lady of Częstochowa and then on August 29th the Solemnity of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist. The common theme that runs through these Feasts and Solemnities is one of witness to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Bartholomew sent out to preach the Gospel in India, Armenia, and possibly Ethiopia, Mesopotamia, Parthia, and Lycaonia. He was martyred for his witness in Armenia. The Blessed Virgin, through the image of the Black Madonna, remind us of Mary's witness to her Son and the power of miracles wrought through her intercession before Him. John proclaimed and witnessed to Jesus' coming and was martyred for proclaiming the truth. May we look to these witnesses and follow their example in our lives.

Receiving the Holy Eucharist

We invited all who believe in the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body and Blood of Christ are placed on the tongue, never in the hand.

It is often said that life is full of disappointments. It is hard to find fulfillment, acceptance, and victory, to reach our goals and end up a winner. We bet on the horse that doesn't win. We put our eggs in the wrong basket. We weren't at the dock when our ship came in.

All of the people hearing Jesus were at the dock (literally since they were in the seaside town of Capernaum). They were in the right place at the right time. The summit was in reach. Their team was about to win. Their hands were about to touch hand of God. And they walked away from Him. and they walked away both in body and soul. While a few stayed, even among those one had lost faith, Judas. This giver of God's body and blood, of God's soul, wasn't what he wanted. He continued to live in his disappointments and that disappointment would later turn to anger and betrayal. Judas... was. almost... there... and lost his faith.

We are faced with the same challenge the crowd in Capernaum faced. Jesus offers us words that are Spirit and life. We continually have Him within our reach and can come to Him to receive His body and blood, His soul to live within us forever. We are almost there. Like Joshua before the people of Israel, we must declare whom we will serve - the gods of the times or the Lord.

We... are... almost... there... If we chose the Lord we have real life, true regeneration, purpose, fulfillment, acceptance, and victory. Let us grasp His hand and find in Him real life.
