LET BROTHERLY LOVE CONTINUE.

We approach a very historic event in our Holy Church. For the first time ever, our Prime Bishop will be holding a nationwide webinar so that all the Church's faithful might gather together to reflect on the theme of brotherly love. See more later in this issue about this event and where we will gather to view the webinar. Even if you cannot join in with the group, you can sign up to view the webinar on-line.

Why the all-out effort on this theme? Hebrews 13:1 states: *Let brotherly love continue.* And this is why we care - to fulfill Jesus' command to love now and always.

As Christ's people, members of His body, recipients of all His good gifts, we are called to honor Jesus' command to act with brotherly love toward one another. Scripture does not treat this command lightly. Both the Old and New Testament call us to love as God loves: *My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.* - John 15:12; *Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.* - Romans 12:10; *Let no*

debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. - Romans 13:8; ... *and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.* - Ephesians 5:2; and *Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters.* - Hebrews 13:1.

The idea and theme of love is as old as God, that is, it is timeless. It wasn't invented when we heard Dionne Warwick sing "What the World Needs Now Is Love"

We are called to sacrificial love - a love so strong that each and every one of us would find the love, kindness, forgiveness, honor, and freedom of God in each other's presence and homes. We must find in our community not license, but rather the true freedom that love provides. We need to find the freedom to do God's will, to sacrifice and carry His cross with each other; to bear it together. Certainly, the world needs love - to find Jesus' love made real in us.

BROTHERLY LOVE WEBINAR



Just prior to the Solemnity of Brotherly Love Prime Bishop Mikovsky will host a webinar for our entire Church on Wednesday – September 9th at 7 pm.

The intent of the webinar is to bring as many PNCC members and others together to hear Prime Bishop's spiritual address and to prepare for the Solemnity through prayer, reflection, music, and meditation. This is the first time in the history of our Holy Church that such an event is taking place. This is very important for our life in Jesus and our Church. I ask all parishioners to take part in this faith filled and historic event.

On Labor day weekend we are reminded of God's call to practice justice, mercy and compassion.

Labor Day comes out of a long history of workers

organizing to secure their rights, safety, and dignity. Our Holy Church stood strong with workers from the coal miners and steel workers of Pennsylvania, the grain millers and meat packers of Buffalo, to the auto workers of Detroit.

In our community and throughout our nation and world, workers continue to struggle for fair pay, time off, safety on the job, access to healthcare and education, and the right to organize. As workers and worker advocates, people of faith have been and continue to be an important part of the movement for worker justice. Here are some ways we can support workers:

PRAY for all workers, especially those in low-wage and unsafe jobs. Pray also for employers and business owners, that they may value people over profit. Pray for our elected leaders, that they place those struggling on the margins at the center of their deliberations.

EDUCATE yourself and other members of your community on worker and economic justice issues.

PAY AND TREAT WORKERS

WELL. If you are in a position to make or influence decisions on worker pay, seek to ensure that all workers are paid wages that can support families and provide family health coverage.

SUPPORT workers who are organizing for better wages and working conditions.

SPÓJNIA SUNDAY

The fourth Sunday of September is designated by our Church as Spójnia Sunday. Spójnia - the Polish National Union - is the Church's fraternal organization that was founded in 1908 by Bp. Hodur and our first generation of parishioners. 107 years ago many first generation Americans did their banking and

insurance business with fraternal organizations. When many of our parishioners were rejected by established fraternal societies due to their membership in our Church, many of them suffered a great deal of financial hardship. Our Church responded with the creation of our own fraternal insurance company and eventually credit union. We saw it as part of our Christian and Church obligation to nurture the spiritual person and also to care for the practical needs of our members as well.

Since 1908 Spójnia has stood right beside our Church. It is the largest contributor to the National Catholic Church. It has assisted the youth of the church, the clergy and the elderly, not to mention the financial and insurance services it provides at a competitive price to our families.

This is why on the fourth Sunday of September we pray for our fraternal each year. We also encourage our members to look into Spójnia's insurance and financial offerings. For more information, please call them at 1- 800-724-6352 or visit www.pnu.org.
