Hey, Sheep!

Do I know you?

Today, our Holy Church honors the humble shepherds, the first to gaze upon Jesus and carry the message of His coming to others.

And when they saw it they made known the saying which had been told them concerning this child; and all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them.

Shepherds had three key responsibilities, to tend, feed, and guard the sheep. To that end they carried quite the kit. They kept a bag made from goat skin in which they carried food and other items. They kept a sling to fight off wild animals, a rod with

a knob on one end, a staff with a hook on the end, a flute for entertainment and to calm the sheep, and a cloak for warmth and to be used as bedding at night

The most amazing relationship developed between the shepherds and their sheep, the sheep would learn to recognize and follow their shepherd's voice.

God has used the image of the shepherd since the creation of the world. Abel, the son of Adam and Eve, was a shepherd. When Israel blessed Joseph he recalled that God had been his shepherd throughout his life.

Jesus is our Good Shepherd, and He does all those things that shepherds do. He feeds us with His body and blood. He tends to us, healing and renewing us. He guards us and protects us so that we will never die.

The key for us is that we grow in relationship with Jesus. We need to recognize His voice. That comes from reading His word, talking with Him in prayer, following His way. Doing that, we will recognize His call, His voice.

Do we know the voice of our Good Shepherd? When we hear His voice, let us all respond with: "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." I will follow your way

Prayer for Christian Unity

"We will all be changed by the Victory of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:51-58)

The material for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2012 was prepared by an ecumenical working group of Churches in Poland. The group focused on the transformative power of faith in Christ. This was based on St. Paul's words to the Corinthian Church which speaks of the temporary nature of our present lives (with all its apparent "victory" and "defeat") in comparison to what we receive through the victory of Christ.

The history of Poland has been marked by a series of defeats and victories; striving to overcome enslavement and the desire for freedom. Yet where there is victory there are also losers who do not share the joy and triumph of the winners. This year's theme reflects on what it means to "win" and to "lose", especially given the way in which the language of "victory" is so often triumphalist. Yet Christ shows us a very different way to win!

When Jesus' disciples disputed over "who was the greatest" it was clear that the impulse to win was strong. But Jesus' reaction was very simple: "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." These words speak of victory through mutual service, helping, boosting the self-esteem of those who are "last", forgotten, excluded. For all Christians, the best expression of service is Jesus Christ, His victory through death and His resurrection. This "victory" is only possible through spiritual transformation and conversion.

There is room for everyone in God's plan of salvation. Through His death and resurrection, Christ embraces all irrespective of winning or loosing, "that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." We too can participate in His victory! It is sufficient to believe in Him, and we will find it easier to overcome evil with good.
