Does God take vacation?

Summertime is traditionally though of as vacation time. This has a lot to do with the academic year. There are a lot of reasons kids get summer off while working adults spend the better part of June, July, and August toiling away as usual, with maybe a couple weeks of vacation in August.

The school year is typically 180 days long. This academic calendar didn't get that way until the early 20th century. Urban schools used to be open year-round. In 1842, Detroit's kids went to school for 260 days, New York's 245, and Chicago's 240. Meanwhile, schools outside cities had much shorter calendars. In the 19th century, rural kids spent just five or six months in school—two to three months in summer and the same in winter—and the rest of the year they labored on farms.

Some of the reasons for shortening the school year included low attendance in summer months - why keep schools open if only a few children were there. Reformers warned that dedicated students might burn out. Physicians felt that students were too frail for so many days at their desk. Finally wealthy folks vacationed during the summer, and middle-class school administrators wanted the same.

Some of these reasons are silly in retrospect, and some educators are pushing for school year-round.

When we reflect on our days, our work, and our vacations we should include some reflection on God's words, *I will not fail you or forsake you*.

God doesn't take vacations, and His life with us is never-ending. He is constant - and we in turn need to be constant. He wants us with Him year-round. Our daily life may follow varied calendars. Let's make sure our calendar starts with time for God every day - and at the start of every week, Sunday's summer, fall, winter, and spring.


