Mary's visit with Elizabeth would not have been possible without the angel Gabriel's visit with Zachariah (Elizabeth's husband) telling him that they would have a son. It would not have been possible without that same angel's visit to Mary, telling her that God desired to place His Son in the world, to visit with us.

All of salvation history is a telling of

God's visitation with us. He wants to be with us, even when we do not want to be with Him. He remains with us and calls us back even when we wander off. He continually calls us into deeper and deeper relationship with Him. He is the visitor that never leaves!

One of the big mistakes we make in our faith journey is that sin somehow burns away our acceptance of Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We think, I sinned and God doesn't want me anymore! I've lost heaven. We need to get rid of that thinking. That thinking is the true work of evil - to make us doubt that God would visit and remain with us. God is truly passionate about us. The only answer to sin is to confess it and to grow into deeper relationship, to get better at hosting the best visitor ever.

As we contemplate our best visitor, let us also take up Mary's example As we get out there to visit this summer, let's talk about the One best visitor ever. Help others invite Him into their lives.

## Memory eternal!

**Rt. Rev. śp. Thomas Gnat**: The previous bishop of the Eastern Diocese, the Rt. Rev. śp. Thomas Gnat entered into his eternal reward

on June 21st following a lengthy illness and failing health. Bishop Gnat was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He was ordained a priest of the PNCC on Sept. 18, 1958. From September 1958 to 1959, Father Gnat was assistant pastor at St. Stanislaus Cathedral. In February 1959, Father Gnat was assigned as pastor of St. Francis PNC Parish in the nation's capital, Washington, D.C., and for a time served as administrator of Holv Cross PNC Parish in Baltimore, Md. During his pastorate in Washington, D.C., Father Gnat represented the Polish National Catholic Church in many instances at national and international events. He was appointed senior priest in 1978, and the same year was elected a bishop of the church and consecrated a bishop in St. Stanislaus Cathedral, Scranton, by the late Prime Bishop Francis Rowinski on the Feast of St. Andrew on Nov. 30, 1978. Bishop of the Eastern Diocese, serving from Nov. 1978 until Nov. 2011. May he rest in peace, and we extend our condolences to his wife Katherine, son Joseph, the rest of his family.



**Very Rev. śp. Stanley Skrzypek**: The previous Senior for the Mohawk Valley, the Very Rev. śp. Stanley Skrzypek entered into his eternal reward on June 24th. Fr. Senior was

most recently pastor of Ss. Peter and Paul parish in Passaic, NJ. Fr. Senior pastored several parishes in the Mohawk Valley including Holy Cross/Sacred Heart in New York Mills and Blessed Virgin Marv of Częstochowa in Albany (at the time). Fr. Senior was actively involved in the Church's ecumenical affairs including the Polish National Catholic - Roman Catholic Dialog Commission, as a contributor to the Orthodox-Old Catholic Agreed Statements and other dialogs with the Union of Utrecht.
