The quote above is from Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Ephesians is about the Church - what is its origin, who is its head, what does it do/what is its mission. Ephesians teaches us that the Church is not an accident or a merely human construct.

The Church is from God and is part of God's whole plan of salvation begun in Jesus Christ's redemptive act of suffering and death. Jesus organized it and sent the Holy Spirit to guide, guard, and inspire it.

As our Church clearly proclaims, the head of the Church is Jesus Christ (Ephesians 4:15). It is not a priest, or a bishop, or a Parish Committee. All of us are its members and while some are appointed, commissioned, and anointed as its ministers, they are not to be raised on a pedestal. They work is to serve in the model of Jesus and to hold the hearts of its members in their hearts.

The Church's mission and commission is to be the very instrument for making God's plan of salvation known throughout the

world. The Church is to make His redemption, His way of life, and the promise of eternal life known and to draw in all who seek true life.

This month we honor those who serve the Church as its ministers its bishops, priests, and deacons. We pause to pray that many more men may step forward to join in this ministry. Why, because many communities are calling out for their ministry and service.

The Epistle from Ephesians is read on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus which we observe this month. It continues: *that He* may grant you in accord with the riches of his glory to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in the inner self, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, rooted and grounded in love, may ...know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge.

Know that I and my fellow servants kneel and pray this for YOU everyday!


