Family honor

Jesus stayed behind in the temple, and His parents went back searching for Him frantically. They found Him and it is said: ...*he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them... And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man.* Jesus didn't appear on earth as an adult. He lived a fully human life. He gave us the perfect example of how we are to live from the day we are born through our entry into eternal life.

Jesus fulfilled His Father's will perfectly. His life and sacrifice and resurrection was not just for us as adults, but for the entire family.

Jesus knew that His Father's commandment to honor father and mother was the only one which carried with it a specific promise do this and you will live a long life that will be filled with goodness. Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and *man* because He did as the Father commanded. He honored His earthly family and His heavenly Father.

This month our Holy Church calls us to honor family in a special way on the Solemnity of the Christian Family (Sunday, October 13th)

The prophet Zachariah gives us a vision of God's future for us. He tells us that God will be with us, His faithful people. Old men and old women shall sit in the streets of the kingdom. The streets will be full of boys and girls playing. He will bring us to dwell in the midst of kingdom; and we shall be His people and He will be our God, in faithfulness and in righteousness.

See God's vision of life as family family that is union with Him in His Church. If we fall short of God's vision for family, return to honoring His plan. Seek His power and aid in becoming the family He would have us be. One family in Jesus forever with a long life filled with goodness.

Solemnity of the Christian Family



The year was 1914. Our Church was meeting in Synod. We were a mainly immigrant Church at the time. Most all of

our members had parents and close relatives and friends still in Europe. Keeping in touch with them was a near impossibility. When our ancestors left, they bid their parents, their family goodbye, possibly for the last time.

In 1914 World War I was just beginning its ravenous charge across that continent. No one at Synod could separate their war anxiety and thoughts of their families from the work at hand. It was from this emotional turmoil that the Solemnity of the Christian Family was born.

As we discussed last month, The Solemnity of Brotherly Love was the Church's response to the internal and external attacks that threatened to tear apart our young Church in 1906. Eight years later it was the Solemnity of the Christian Family that emerged as the ember of hope amid the mass destruction and inhumanity of World War I. When the too often taken for granted gift of family was threatened by separation and war, the Synod delegates realized again its irreplaceable importance. They created this unique Solemnity to remind us all of the gift that is family and of the moral charge that is the Christian family.

We live in a world that pulls us in a hundred directions simultaneously. Families struggle to find time to share together. We barely eat together, watch the same television programs together, or even worship together. We have lost touch with the concept of a day of rest - a day on which we used to reconnect as family and community.

On the Solemnity of the Christian Family, we offer our prayers to God that with so much on our plates we do not allow it to become too much. And since these are prayers for the Christian Family, not only our individual families, we pray that families make time for Christ and His Holy Church.

I hope all of our families will accept the Church's and my invitation to join us for worship on this special Solemnity in their entirety. Please extend our invitation to the more reluctant members of your family. Invite them to join with you and with the family of God as we celebrate the often overlooked gift that is family. And, if you know families who are not worshipping anywhere, please extend an invitation to them to come join us for worship on this special day.
