Some, as today, may have been driven away based on a bad encounter with a pastor, some member or members of the church, or with some requirement of faith.

Whatever were the reasons, the apostle says that we must regard it as a sacred duty to meet together for the worship of God. No causes should deter us. From this sacred social duty grace is received, we are strengthened, our light is increased, and our heavenly inheritance is confirmed. See you September 18th at 9:30am or 11:30am.
