2014 is the 100th Anniversary of our Confession of Faith. If you haven't read it in quite a while, check out a copy from our parish library.

In 1953, Bishop Francis Hodur passed from this world and on to eternal life with Christ. He died at the age of 86. At the age of 30 he assumed the demanding role of serving as the pastor of an independent Catholic parish, which became the springboard for the rise of an independent Catholic Church the PNCC. He died just shy of the 56th anniversary of his ministry to our Holy Church and its people. He died with only enough money to pay for his funeral. Everything he had body, soul and treasure - he gave to the Church. We will offer special requiem prayers on Sunday, February 16th in his memory and honor.
