Our Gospels throughout Lent carry us through a series of ups and downs.

We begin with Jesus' forty days of fasting and prayer in the dessert. He comes out of the experience tired, hungry, and likely longing for companionship. What does He get? Temptation.

The following week Jesus is revealed to His apostles in the glory of the Transfiguration. All is beautiful and pure. Then we meet the Samaritan woman at the well and experience her dialog with Jesus. Her sins come to the surface and Jesus reveals that He is the Messiah Who can give her "living water." Next we meet a blind man. Most blame his blindness on sin. Jesus cures him. We see the doubt and disbelief of the Pharisees. The blind man's parents are afraid and the Pharisees throw him out of the temple. He meets Jesus again and in the midst of the let-downs he's faced he professes his belief in Jesus. He said, "I do believe, Lord." On Passion Sunday Jesus weeps as he comforts Martha and Mary on the death of their brother Lazarus. We see the pain of death and separation, weeping and mourning, and Mary's declaration of faith: "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." Finally we rejoice at the raising of Lazarus.

Returning to the Samaritan woman, Jesus says to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

Life is filled with ups and downs, pains and joys. Let us use this walk through Lent to strengthen our faith and reliance on Jesus, on His word, on His grace, and on our family in faith. Let us continually ask Him for His living water - water from a well that never runs dry, that we all share in, and that will refresh and sustain us through all of our ups and downs.



Did you know that our Parish has many organizations that <u>need</u> you?



Friend Sunday is March 30th. It is an annual day when churches join together and encourage their members to reach out and invite friends and family to a special service where friendship is honored and encouraged.



SEASON OF LENT

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5th. On this day we consciously receive ashes on our heads to symbolize penitence, humility and mortality. The ashes we use are the burned remnants of previous Palm Sunday palms.



When the people of Jerusalem realized that Jesus did not come to give them earthly power - but life everlasting (something they refused to grasp) the palms used to

welcome Him turned to the ashen shouts of "Crucify Him!"

The powerful reminder in these ashes calls us into a Lent filled with sacred opportunities to return to a right relationship with Christ, to follow Jesus instead of trying to tell Him what He should do.

Lent is the time to increase our prayer, sacrifice, fasting, charity, and forgiveness.

With this in mind, the parish offers the Lenten Devotion of Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm.

Remember too that the Holy Church asks us to fast and abstain from meat every Wednesday and Friday in Lent and from Holy Wednesday through holy Saturday. This practice helps us to remember Jesus' sacrifice every time we sit down to eat a meal. If we can't give up

something as simple as a ham sandwich, how can we fight heavier temptation? Now is the time to train with the easy stuff (but it seems so hard) so we can better fight the really tough things that try to draw us away from Jesus.

I hope and pray each of us will use these 40 very special days to the greatest possible good.

SOLEMNITY OF THE INSTITUTION

This year the Solemnity of the Institution of the Polish National Catholic Church falls on the First Sunday of Lent.
As such, the First Sunday of Lent takes liturgical precedence and is celebrated.
Nevertheless let us remember and pray on this commemoration of the organization
