What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that."

We have all sorts of plans, but we are reminded that our plans are completely dependent of God's will. We need to keep Him as our Center regardless of where we are or what we are doing. (4) It's really fun to worship God with a different group of believers. When you worship with another group of Christ-followers, you are always home, worshipping the same God! Place your plans and vacation in God's hands and it will be awesome!

A Neighborhood Tragedy and Our Response

On Friday, June 27th at 1am, police were called to our neighborhood. 28-year old Angel Carrion was dead. Killed by a gunshot wound to the chest.

Angel was a father of three, a friend to many in the area, someone who was brother to those who weren't even his family. His childhood friend Jorge said, "He was a good friend. He was a good father. He helped out the community. Nobody is perfect in this world, but he didn't deserve this."

Indeed, and this was a tragedy for our neighborhood which calls for a response. Respond we did. Our parish was filled on Sunday the 29th. We stood together in prayer for the repose of Angel's soul and for our neighborhood, especially its



youth and children. It is not grand gestures that will make a difference, but rather our prayer in faith and the little

things we do in speaking a friendly word to our neighbors, in showing care for the young people in our neighborhood.

The whole parish took to the streets following services to pray for and bless our neighborhood. We called upon the power of God to care for all its residents, to end violence, to free it of drugs, to grant justice for all, and to wrap it in His mantel of protection. We also prayed for the soul of Angel - Eternal rest grant unto him.

Prayers offered with the confidence of faith are heard by our Heavenly Father. He will grant what we ask.

A Summer of Solemnities, Feasts, and Commemorations

Every summer contains a group of special days in the life of the Church. We begin on July 2nd with the celebration of the Solemnity of the Visitation of the B.V.M. On this day we remember the day that Mary arrived at her cousin Elizabeth's door. She came to serve Elizabeth and help her through her pregnancy. Elizabeth received Mary's help with graciousness. We too are called to respond to the needs of others with generosity and respond to those who step forward to pray for and help us with graciousness.

On July 6th we commemorate John Hus, Priest and Martyr who was an early advocate of reform in the Church. He stood against bishops, and particularly the Bishop of Rome, who were taking up the sword in the name of the Church. He encouraged them to pray for enemies and bless those that curse them. He also urged reform, denouncing payment for indulgences noting that people obtain forgiveness of sins by true repentance, not money. He was burned at the stake for heresy against the doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church on July 6, 1415. Our Church commemorates him and his efforts toward reform which our Church later carried out.

On July 25th we celebrate the Feast of St. James the Greater, Apostle. James, son of Zebedee is traditionally considered the first apostle to be martyred. He was a son of Zebedee and Salome, and brother of John the Apostle. He was one of the first disciples to join Jesus. James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration. The Acts of the Apostles records that "Herod the king" had James executed by sword. James the Greater is the patron saint of Spain and of veterinarians, equestrians, furriers, tanners, and pharmacists.

On July 26th we commemorate Ss. Joachim & Ann, Parents of the B.V.M., particularly for their faithfulness in raising Mary. On August 4th we celebrate the Feast of the Finding of the Body of St. Stephen. This feast commemorates the finding of the body of Saint Stephen, the first martyr, in 416. Let us proclaim Jesus in word and deed today as boldly as Saint Stephen did, no matter the cost.

August 6th is the Solemnity of the Transfiguration of the Lord. August 15th is the Solemnity of the Dormition of the B.V.M. when we commemorate her earthly death and entry into eternal life with her son, Jesus which the Church counts as miraculous.

August 25th is the Feast of St. Bartholomew the Apostle. August 26th is the Solemnity of Our Lady of Częstochowa, Patroness of Poland

On August 29th we celebrate the Solemnity of the Beheading of St. John the Baptist. John preached repentance and was therefore very unpopular. Let us do as John did!
