I can just hear my mom saying words similar to what God spoke through His Apostles in Hebrews 13:5 - "be satisfied with what you have."

The explicit promise in our being "satisfied with what you have" is God's provision for us. God will reach to the last grain of sand and the remotest star to bless us. I will never run away from you.

During this month let us consider the depth of God's provision. God promises to always be with us, to stay at our side, to make it all alright. When we face challenges, even if the entire world has abandoned us, even if our mom were to reject us, God remains.

Early on God's people felt abandoned and alone. They were exiled. The Prophet Isaiah gave them God's word: "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb? Even should she forget, I will never forget you."

There is nothing that can stand between God and us, His love is the perfection of all love and is for us. Let us be joyfully satisfied.

Solemnity of the Ascension

Bishop Joseph Padewski, Martyr

On Tuesday, May 10th, we commemorate the 65th anniversary of Bishop Joseph Padewski.

Bishop Padewski was born February 18, 1894 in Antoniów, a small farming village near Radom in Poland. He emigrated to the United States in 1913 and moved to Detroit, Michigan. In Detroit he came into contact with the Polish National Catholic Church. In 1916 he entered the PNCC Seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood on December 16, 1919 by Prime Bishop Francis Hodur. He celebrated his first mass at the Church of the Good Shepherd in Plymouth, Pennsylvania.

In 1942 Bishop Padewski was arrested by the Nazis and was held at the Montelupich prison in Krakow. He was then transferred to the

Tittmoning POW Camp in Germany where he was held for 18 months. Through the intervention of the Swiss Red Cross he was freed and returned to the United States in March 1944.

Between 1944 and 1946 Bishop Padewski served as pastor of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Czestochowa Church in Albany, New York.

Bishop Padewski returned to Poland on February 20, 1946 to resume his duties as Bishop of the Polish branch of the PNCC.

Shortly after his return, the Soviet Union completed its takeover of Poland and asserted Communist control. In this atmosphere of Stalinist terror, Bishop Padewski was arrested by the Communist Secret Police (UB) in Warsaw and was held at their prison on Rakowieckiej Street.

Bishop Padewski died on May 10, 1951 as a result of secret police questioning and maltreatment.

Bishop Padewski, martyr for the faith, pray for us.

A Year of Reverence Update

As we continue in our Year of Reverence we focus on Reverence in the family. We know how important the Christian Family is especially in our ever changing and more secular society.

It is in the family setting where children learn their values and about the Catholic faith. May we teach them reverence by setting an example for them in dealing with life situations. We show reverence in the family by incorporating three things into our day to day situations with our children, spouses, parents, siblings and others:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Living the Ten Commandments
- 3. Living the Two Commandments of Love
- 4. Prayer

Make time to pray together - teach your children to pray - help them to learn the importance of giving thanks to God. There are many ways to do this - one way is to pray before meals. Here are some prayers from our 2010 PNCC Prayer Book:

Grace Before Meals: Bless us, O Lord, and these Your gifts, which we are about to receive from Your bounty. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Grace After Meals: We give You thanks, O Almighty God, for all Your mercies, Who lives and reigns forever. Amen.

Morning and Evening Prayer is very important as well as it teaches our children and reminds us of the importance God has in our lives and how we are called to live holy and virtuous lives as His holy people. The Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be... can be offered in additional to various petitions and words of thanksgiving and praise.

A Parent's Prayer

Loving God and Father, You gave me my child (children) and I am committed to bring him (her, them) up in the Church in love of You. Assist me in this sacred duty. Teach me what to give him (her, them) and what to withhold; when to correct and when to refrain; when to be gentle and when to be firm. May my child (children) grow in Your grace and in piety. By word and example may I lead him (her, them) in the ways of faith, wisdom and love. I pray that I may fulfill my parental responsibilities that You have placed upon me, so that my child (children) may be faithful to You and Your Church. Through
