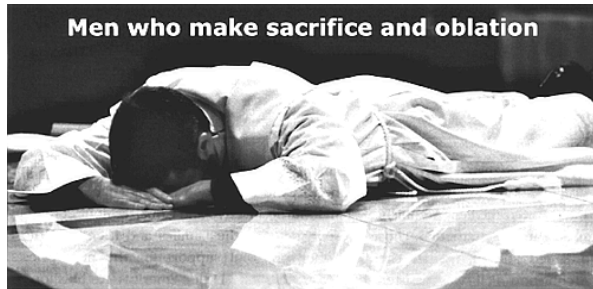

Clergy Pension – Donate and Pray



Did you know that our priests receive a pension from the Church? On Father's Day, we are asked to make donations toward that pension fund. They are so very needed.

Why pray – because, frankly, the picture says it all – pennies. Our pension plan is so poor that our retired clergy often end up impoverished. A retired priest and his spouse receive a total of \$600 per month. They lose their housing

and all the other benefits they had as active clergy and must venture out to live on that meager amount. They sacrificed their lives for their flock, they must sacrifice again. Should the priest die, the widow is left with \$300 a month. What a shame!

BISHOP BERNARD'S PASTORAL LETTER ON VOCATIONS

June 1, 2018

To the Very Reverend, Reverend Fathers and the Reverend Messrs., and my dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus our Lord:

¡Viva el mes de junio! That's Spanish for "Long live June," "Hurray for June." Hurray, indeed! And welcome to the month of vocations in the Polish National Catholic Church: June is Sacred Vocations month for us. June is the month we focus on our great need for priests, and on the need for significant donations throughout the PNCC to be made to the Clergy Pension Plan.

Our need of priests is dire and critical, but I am nonetheless hopeful and optimistic. Even though no Polish National Catholic families have sacrificed even one of their men, young or old, to our altars in the past twelve years, (and it doesn't look like any family will in the near future), I remain optimistic. Even though our seminary has been empty for that period of time, except for the

occasional priest from another Church orienting himself there to work as a priest in the PNCC, I have good reason to hope because I have experienced God's providence. Our parish in Denver was declining but was pulled back from the brink of closure by an Hispanic priest from Mexico and 90 people of Mexican heritage who now comprise the great majority of that parish. St Francis, Denver, is growing, and is enthusiastically PNCC, and is flying 18 young people and 6 adults to Convo 2018 here next month.

Because Father Alfonso Castillo needs pastoral help there, I enthusiastically agreed to review applications from priest friends of his in Mexico to provide assistance to him, and subsequently serve our American parishes desperate for priests. In our Diocese, two priests, in fine parishes, are retiring next year. I have no one to fill them. A priest in our Diocese is on three parishes in Jersey. Three priests are on two parishes each. And there are ailing and aging priests all over the place! And yet I am hopeful. So I say, ¡Viva México!

With the increase in aging clergy comes the need for our Clergy Pension Plan to support them all. We collect for this vital entitlement throughout the year and especially in the month of June. We need more capital to invest, the interest from which the pension payments are made. From age 70, a PNCC priest can look forward to a monthly check in the amount of \$600; and his

widow, a check in the amount of \$300. Please be generous in this drive. And so I say, in my optimism, ¡Viva el Plan de Pensión del Clero! (Hurray for our Clergy Pension plan!)

I believe God is showing us a potential direction for the future of our Church; and that pathway seems to be presenting itself from south of the border. For the Methodist Church, that pathway is from South Korea, and for the Roman Catholic Church, from India among other sources. In light of all of this, Bishop Hodur has indeed blessed us with a most optimistic motto for our Church when he penned: *A través de la Verdad, el Trabajo y las Dificultades ¡Venceremos!*

Therefore, obtain by your humility forgiveness for your unrighteousness. What salt is to every food, humility is to every virtue; it can break the strength of numberless sins... If we possess it, it can make us children of God and lead us to God even without the help of good works. That is why, without it, our works are of no value, our virtues are vain, and vain, too, is all our effort.

On sacrifice

Here is an example from the writings of St. Gregory of Nyssa (4th century). These acts of mercy are the "sacrifices" which increase our holiness.

Even the night must not interrupt your works of mercy. Do not say: "Go, come back tomorrow and I will give it to you" (Prov 3:28). Nothing must come between your intention and your carrying out your act of kindness... "Share your bread with the hungry; bring the afflicted and the homeless into your house" (Is 58:7) and do so with joy and alacrity. "One who does acts of mercy, says Saint Paul, let him do so with cheerfulness" (Rom 12:8). Then your good deed is doubled by your readiness. On the other hand, what is offered reluctantly and under constraint is unwelcome and unadorned. Good deeds must be cheerful, not doleful... "Then your light shall break forth like the dawn

and your wound shall be quickly healed" (Is 58:8). No who is there who does not long for light and healing?...

I often wonder - on "saints" who hate us and feasts that do not exist

As members of our Holy Church, we have a beautiful array of saints and of solemnities and feasts - those honored by the historic Church prior to the corruption and evil brought about by papal infallibility - and those specific to our Church.

Alleged Marian Feasts and Appearances - As members and faithful of the Church we should use great care in rejecting alleged doctrines and feast that are inconsistent with the historic Church.

Specifically, we must reject the doctrines of the alleged Immaculate Conception and the Assumption of the B.V.M. We are also called to reject anything that allegedly 'adds' to Jesus' teaching and Divine revelation. Jesus gave us all instruction and the Father poured out the gift of the Holy Spirit for our understanding. As such, things like alleged Marian appearances at places like "Fatima, Lourdes, Knock, La Salette, Medjugorje" and others hold nothing for us and in fact detract from Jesus as our teacher and Savior.

Divine Mercy - We should always trust and put our faith in God's mercy and we should rightly fear His justice. That is natural for every Christian.

Another false and destructive Roman Catholic practice we must reject is the alleged appearances of Jesus to a Roman Catholic nun in Poland. Even the Roman Church rejected the fantasies of Sr. Maria Faustyna Kowalska until Karol Wojtyła became Bishop of Rome and instituted the nun as a saint and elevated her fantasy to a feast. He beatified 1,340 people and canonized 483 'saints,' more than the combined tally of all his predecessors in five centuries. Included therein are 'saints' and special observances from his native land. This unfortunate venture into nationalist ego has mislead many. The Sunday after Easter in our Holy Church is called Low Sunday.

...and they hate us - I have seen members of your Holy Church hold devotion to some recently invented saints. This is ironic, since as a rule, these Roman Catholic 'saints' hated us as a Church and as people. They sought only our 'conversion' and subjugation. For instance:

The mission Maximilian Kolbe entrusted to his 'Knights of the Immaculata' was converting the whole world to the Catholic Church. He said, "Only until all schismatics **[you and me]** ...profess the Catholic Creed with conviction, - only then will the Immaculata have reached its goals."

Sr. Faustina created a novena and taught her adherents to pray: "Today bring to Me the souls of heretics and schismatics... During My bitter Passion they **[that is you and me]** tore at My Body and Heart... As they return to unity with the Church My wounds heal and in this way they alleviate My Passion. Most Merciful Jesus... receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of heretics and schismatics. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart... Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of heretics, and schismatics, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces obstinately persisting in their errors **[do we feel this way about ourselves?]**."

The alleged Fatima apparitions taught: "Refute schismatics **[that is you and me]**."

Before picking up some 'saint,' do some research and find out - what would they say about me?
