## The days can be...

Brothers and sisters: Watch carefully how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil.

St. Paul was not speaking of anything new, at least in part of his letter to the Church at Ephesus. In a certain way, everyone had and has heard it before: the days are evil.

The roman poet Cicero wrote "O tempora o mores" a little over one hundred years before Paul was to write to the Ephesians. It translates literally as 'Oh the times! Oh the customs!' The inference is that the times and the customs are far worse today than the old days. Edgar Allen Poe used Cicero's quote as a title for one of his poems.
