WHO IS IT THAT OVERCOMES THE WORLD EXCEPT THE ONE WHO BELIEVES THAT JESUS IS THE SON OF GOD?

I see tons of advertising every day. Of course it comes through television and radio - old school advertising. Being so involved in life online between emails, social media, work and websites I feel inundated! Looking at something on Amazon is typically followed by months of emails and online targeted ads pushing that product I happened to stumble on.

February 2nd brings the celebration of all advertising, the Super Bowl. I think more people watch for the ads than for the game. One of my clergy friends used to say that if he won the lottery we would all see an ad for our Church in the midst of the Super Bowl. I hope he wins really big because it now takes \$5.6 million for a thirty second ad spot.

Yesterday, I received another one of those Valentine's Day ads coming through almost every minute. Its point: 'It is not too late. Jim, you've still got time to pull off a great romantic dinner at one of the local spots that couples love.'

Well, I'm glad for that chance. We

luckily already have a plan for that day.

We worry about being too late all the time. Even St. Paul recalled sadly that he was one born untimely, too late, out of time as the least of the Apostles, and as one who had done wrong before that moment of conversion. He saw himself as diminutive and weakly.

If St. Paul left it there, constantly worrying about being too late, we would only see a sad and pathetic figure. Instead, he finds confidence and reassures us in saying "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace to me was not without effect."

In this 'month of love' and month that begins this year's Great and Holy Lent, St. John reminds us that the message and trick in advertising - you're going to miss out - is untrue. St. James and St. Paul both tell us that we cannot be too late. Our victory is assured because we believe in Jesus, the Son of God, and because His grace is alive in us to great effect.

## The Pre-Lenten Season

The pre-Lenten season begins February 9th. The Pre-Lenten Season of Septuagesima is a period of preparation before the beginning of the liturgical season of Lent. Septuagesima includes three Sundays, Septuagesima Sunday (70 days to Easter), Sexagesima Sunday (60 days to Easter), and Quinguagesima Sunday (50 days to Easter). We are called to make a special point of self-examination, of considering the things we need to repent of, and what amendments of life or areas of spiritual growth we need God's help to accomplish. Make this time worthy and blessed by asking for God's never too late grace.

## How to Deepen Your Communication With God

Do you yearn to know the God of the universe deeply? Do you want to know Jesus and communicate with him as a close personal friend?

The process for doing so is simpler than you might think. There is a pathway to intimacy with your Creator. The best first step is with communication. In other words, prayer.

All relationships are built on communication, right? Prayer is simply communicating with God. Anyone can pray; it doesn't take a special language or a degree from a Bible college. All it takes is a willingness to make the time to talk with God.

Maybe, though, you have always felt as if God helps other people who are more holy or more kind or more pure than you are. Maybe you view God as hard to please, quicker to say no than to say yes. You keep trying to follow the rules or practice the rituals or join the right religion. If only you could get God to get on your team!

But the path of deep communion with the Father is not about



performance. It's not about keeping rules. It's not about saying the right words at the right time with the right emphasis. It's not having all your life in order so that you never mess up and you can say, "Okay, God. Now will You answer my prayer?"

Being close to God is all about understanding who God really is.

See, most of our focus on communication with God is all about us. What we do, or what we don't do. But communion with God is about Him. Maybe you view God as hard to please, as begrudging you a positive response. But God is eager to bless. He loves you. He is warm and receptive. And for Him, following rules, ritual, or religious performance mean nothing. He sees through all that and looks right into your heart and says, *"Come unto Me all you that labor and are heavy laden and I will refresh you."* 

Remember, He is the God who left the glory of heaven, and took on human flesh to walk for 30 or so years on earth, and then die upon a cross and be raised from the dead. All this was to let you know, "*This is what God the Father is like*."

So yes, God wants to bless you and be a companion to you. Here's what I suggest. When you wake up – before you've checked social media or made breakfast or done 30 minutes on your Pelaton – pause for prayer. Remind yourself that "The God of all the universe, He's my God and He's with me and He's powerful to deliver."

"For his unfailing love toward those who fear him is as great as the height of the heavens above the earth. He has removed our sins as far from us as the east is from the west. The Lord is like a father to his children, tender and compassionate to those who fear him" (Psalm 103:11-13).

He is waiting. He knows everything that's going to happen to you today, and He's waiting for you to say, "Lord, help me." He knows your heart, your hopes and fears, and He's waiting for you to say, "Lord, I need You." He sees your future, and He's waiting for you to say, "Lord, guide me."

You are the object of His affection, purchased by the blood of Christ. Talk to Him.
