In this, our centennial year, we are taking opportunities to look back with thankfulness and ahead with determination. It seems that along with the blessings of this year we have experienced the blessing of an ever more active parish. Things are going full steam ahead and are only going to increase.

Just consider our Lenten journey. It is not only Holy Mass on Sundays, but also Stations on Fridays, Bitter Lamentations every other Wednesday, as well as ongoing Together in Faith and Love Zoom meetings every Thursday, time spent at the parish working on our centennial plans, and undertaking projects that need doing.

During other seasons of the year we have added many worthy liturgical practices such as Rorate Holy Masses on Wednesday mornings in Advent and weekly and monthly Rosary devotions as well as our monthly healing Holy Mass.

We have an exceptionally rich heritage of prayer, music, and service before the Lord and we have been blessed more than abundantly. We share that abundance both in the parish building and virtually on Facebook and YouTube.

Prior to current circumstances we held two Holy Masses on Sundays and were working toward a daily Holy Mass schedule. Two Holy Masses will return on Sundays and Daily Holy Mass will (God willing) begin this year.

The scripture quote above comes from Romans 13:11. It falls under the scriptural category of heritage. This passage reminds us that heritage is not a stagnant looking back, but rather a light guiding our preparation for the future, looking forward, constantly growing.

In this Season of Lent and this centennial year let us resolve to press ever onward, eyes forward, to the salvation promises made to us on Easter: Freedom from every evil; Full possession of all that is good and glorious; Growth and increase in the graces and gifts of the Holy Spirit; Being brought nearer to the saints; and Greater enjoyment of God's marvelous love than we had when we first believed.

Our Lenten Journey Toward Holy Week



We began our Lenten journey on February 17th, Ash Wednesday, with Holy Mass at 7pm. Each Friday we gather to observe the

sacred tradition of Stations of the Cross at 7pm. Every other Wednesday we gather for Bitter Lamentations / Gorzkie żale at 7pm. These observances help us better understand the loving devotion Jesus had for us, to the point where He gives up His life for us. Walk with Him today so that we may rejoice with Him on the last day.

Lent is time devoted to repentance, a turning away from the ways, events, and situations that are harmful to us. This Lent we focus on Lenten disciplines and what they help us achieve..

Let us live Lent mindfully with prayer (Holy Mass, Stations, Lamentations, private prayer, bible reading, our Church-wide Lenten retreat on March 23rd), sacrifice (fasting), penance (recollection of and turning away from sinful behaviors), and charity (Lenten giving).

We ask you to participate in our annual directed giving campaign as an act of charity and almsgiving to offer up food and other things needful for those in our local community.


Passiontide begins March 21st and Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on March 28th.

Holy Scriptures: Wisdom 5:1-5; 1 Timothy 4:1-5; John 15:1-7

Reflection: Bishop Francis Hodur was called by God and his people to organize our Polish National Catholic Church. This began on the second Sunday of March in 1897. Bishop Hodur said: "Our Church cannot be a blind, soulless copy of any

Christian church. It must reach to the source of religious life, Christ the Lord. If we do not have Jesus' principles more adapted to life and effectively active, we do not have the right to life. Therefore, to work!"

<u>Prayer</u>: Almighty and merciful God, You called a humble priest, Father Francis Hodur, to be Your servant and to awaken Your people for work in Your vineyard. Grant that, as we remember Your call to us this month, our faith may be made firm and our hearts may be enkindled by the fire of sacrificial love.

Action Item: Find two ways in which we can make Christ's principles and teachings more effective and evident in our lives as we remember our First Bishop and how he followed and served Jesus.

Happy 100th Anniversary

This year we celebrate the 100th Anniversary of our parish's founding in Schenectady.

Our parish has some really amazing artifacts, part of the wonderful legacy we have inherited. Among these are:

The chandelier at the center of the church's nave: The chandelier came from the Grand Union Hotel in

Saratoga Springs. The chandelier had been located in the grand parlor of the hotel. The historic hotel began as a boarding house built by Gideon Putnam in 1802, and eventually grew into the world's largest hotel. The hotel was demolished between 1952 and 1953. Ironically, after it was



demolished the hotel's vacant lot became the site of a Grand Union Supermarket.

The church's bells: We are still trying to track down the history of the church's two bells. Thankfully, those glorious bells (a great bell and a tolling bell) are still in place and functional. Parish lore informs us that the bells were forged at the American Locomotive Company (ALCO) in Schenectady where many of our parishioners worked.

Tadeusz Kszesniak created the Szopka which has been displayed in our church for the Christmas season for over 30 years. Tadeusz immigrated from Poland in the late 1970's. Tadeusz had offered his artwork to St. Paul's R.C. parish in Schenectady where it was rejected. He approached Stefan Węglinski from our parish who gladly accepted it.
