FOR GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD, THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY SON, THAT WHOEVER BELIEVES IN HIM SHOULD NOT PERISH BUT HAVE ETERNAL LIFE.

We have a God of unconditional love. In John 3:16 quoted above we recall that verse which many of us memorized early in life, or at least we recognize it from sporting events. It may be the greatest verse in the Bible! It tells us about a God who loves us unconditionally.

You see, our great God loves us so much, that He was willing to send His only begotten Son to die for us so that our sins be washed away. He gave His all to destroy the barrier that separates us from Him and each other. He loves us so much that He showed us what was to come, that thing we celebrate every Easter, the resurrection of the dead – when we will all appear as Jesus did – in glorified bodies.

We also recall that God loves us so much that He did not create any complicated rules, or hoops to jump through, to get to Him. He only asks one thing – faith: To believe in the Lord Jesus by confessing our sins and making Him the Lord of our lives. Then living in His Kingdom community.

We make things complex in this world because it is difficult to grasp the full meaning of what it is to love unconditionally. We place conditions on love. We read in realities in our relationships that are not really present. We need to stop that.

The little word 'so' in John 3:16 means that God loves us mightily! He loves us with an unconditional love that is not based upon circumstances, wants, or as part of any deal. God's love is not based upon what we do, what we can do, or what we have done in our life. He only desires that we actively love as He does.

Perhaps in a very special and unique way we connect with that aspect of God during the month of May for we reflect on the unconditional way in which Mary offered herself to God's service and the way our mothers gave of themselves unconditionally for us.

God's mighty unconditional love is what we must both cherish and give; love without reason or excuse. So let us love in God's way.

The Angelus is a devotion commemorating the Incarnation of Jesus. The devotion is the recitation of three verses and responses

from the Bible and praying the Hail Mary in between.

During most seasons of the year the Angelus goes as follows:

- §. The Angel of the LORD declared unto Mary
- R. And she conceived of the Holy Ghost.

Hail Mary...

- R. Be it done unto me according to thy word.

Hail Mary...

- y. And the Word was made flesh.
- R. And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary...

- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Amen.

During the Easter Season, these words are replaced by Queen of Heaven

- R. The Son you merited to bear,

alleluia,

- V. Has risen as he said, alleluia.
- R. Pray to God for us, alleluia.
- R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray: O God, who have been pleased to gladden the world by the Resurrection of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that through his Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may receive the joys of everlasting life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

In offering these prayers we bind ourselves closely with Mary asking that she intercede for us.

Solemnity of the Ascension




The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension on the 40th day after Easter as is recorded in the Acts of the Apostles.

May 2022 Discipleship Example - Devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament

During the month of May we honor the Theotokos (The Mother of God – The Blessed Virgin Mary). We do this in part through the Liturgical Worship of the Church, one paraliturgical service we celebrate is May Devotions. The Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary with the Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Holy Scriptures: John 6 (Bread of Life Discourse); Luke 1:36; John 1:14

Reflection:

The Blessed Virgin Mary gave her consent to God through the Archangel Gabriel: "Behold I am the servant of the Lord, be it done unto me according to your word." Then, "The word became flesh and dwelt among us." Mary's yes to God resulted in receiving Jesus into her heart, mind, body and soul and we receive Jesus in our hearts, minds, bodies and souls by receiving Holy Communion and adoring His presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

From the PNCC Prayer Book (p. 113-114):

Make our dear Lord in the Blessed Sacrament your constant thought; remember that He is your friend; tell Him all your sorrows; go often in the week, if only for a few minutes, to relieve your mind in trouble, and you will find that the hardest trials will seem to pass away in a moment. Go to Him always, you will wonder at the fullness of the comfort and support which you will receive, and at the clearness of the answers that will come in time of doubt. Place your cares into the hands of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and they will become light, very light. Jesus, my God, I adore You, here present in the Sacrament of Your love.

Divine Redeemer, Who in Your infinite goodness has been pleased to give Your precious Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist, I adore You with the most profound respect. I thank You for all the favors You have bestowed upon me, especially for the institution of this Most Holy Sacrament. As You are the source of every blessing, bestow Your benediction upon me, my relatives and friends. Bless my Church, bishops, priests, deacons and all those for whom I pray (especially ...). Let Your blessing flow abundantly and may it be felt in the souls of those who cannot come here to receive it. May the weak and tempted feel its power wherever they may be. Let all feel its influence, moving them to come to You. O Lord, grant me a strong love of You, a hatred of sin, a greater respect of grace, and great zeal for your honor and glory and for my sanctification and salvation. Amen.

Action Item: Offer this reflection from our PNCC Prayer Book weekly during this month giving reverence and respect to the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament.


