REMEMBER THE WORDS OF THE LORD JESUS, HOW HE HIMSELF SAID, 'IT IS MORE BLESSED TO GIVE THAN TO RECEIVE.'

Summer is here and it is time for all kinds of great activities: swimming, visits to parks, camping, trips away, grilling, and tending to flowers and vegetable plants.

Did you ever get in one of those situations where that summer activity gets slightly curtailed because you forgot something? You have the charcoal but forgot the matches. You want to dig out the soil around those plants but can't find your gardening shovel, oh - and you forgot the sunscreen.

In those types of situations we often run across a good samaritan, a neighbor, friend, the person on the towel next to you at the shore, even just a passer-by who notices the situation (and frustration) and offers to help. Take my matches, borrow my shovel, here's some sunscreen...

St. Paul was addressing the Elders of the Church in Ephesus. He was planning his leaving for Jerusalem and the persecutions that lay ahead (See Acts 20 starting at verse 17). He tells them the things they will face and implores them to be strong. He gives thanks for those who saw to his needs saying Jesus' words: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'

Faith is somewhat like our summer adventures. We all start from a place of borrowing. We borrow from and imitate our families and community. As we progress in our lives our faith becomes our own, becomes solid, we own it and take responsibility for it. We are ready for action and are living faithfully day-to-day.

Occasionally though we need help, we've forgotten something or left something behind. We need to borrow from friends, mentors, family, the passer-by. We need help filling in the gaps in our journey toward Jesus.

The key here, as Paul told the Elders, is to: *be alert*. We must not live on a faith that is merely borrowed or imitated, it must be our own. We need to invest the time to grow in it. We continually prepare ourselves and are *alert* for gaps. Let us be open to receiving help and also be willing to lend help, and be blessed.

There Is Nothing Ordinary About Singing

On Saturday, August 13th, a summer music workshop entitled There Is Nothing Ordinary About Singing the Ordinaries, will be conducted by the Music Commission of our Diocese. It will take place here at our Cathedral in Scranton from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on that day. The workshop will focus on providing instruction and resources for singing the Ordinaries of the Mass (e.g., Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei), something we already do in our parish - and this gives us an opportunity to help others.

Participants will learn to sing appropriate Mass settings, learn about where to find resources for them, and be instructed about how to implement the sung settings with their congregations and choirs.

Participants will find it very helpful to bring their personal computers/ devices to the workshop in order to have a hands-on experience in accessing resources.

This workshop is intended for all church musicians including organists, choir and music directors, choir members, and clergy.

What's Fr. Jim Reading

Thankfully, our Diocese has extended funding, not only for enlivening but also for clergy continuing education. Fr. Jim is exploring several options for broadening his horizons educationally. If you have suggestions for where improvement or further development may be needed, please feel free to share those with him.

Some recent books Father has covered:

Spirit of Fire: The Life and Vision of Pierre Teilhard De Chardin by Ursula King. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin—renowned French Jesuit theologian, mystic, and scientist helped bring Christian theology into creative dialogue with modern science and explored profound dimensions of the human condition. Interesting parallels to Bishop Hodur's approach toward the development of the human person and society.

<u>Mere Christianity</u> by C. S. Lewis. Mere Christianity is C.S. Lewis' forceful and accessible doctrine of Christian belief. First heard as informal radio broadcasts and then published as three separate books, The Case for Christianity, Christian Behavior, and Beyond Personality, Mere Christianity brings together what Lewis sees as the fundamental truths of the religion. Interesting to listen to the Audible version. It is like hearing Lewis himself.

On The Apostolic Tradition by Hippolytus (Author), John Behr (Editor), Alistair Stewart-Sykes (Introduction, Translator, Commentator). Apostolic Tradition, as this text is best known, was identified in the early years of the twentieth century as the work of Hippolytus, a Christian leader from third-century Rome. The text provides liturgical information of great antiquity, and as such has been massively influential on liturgical study and reform.

No Irrelevant Jesus: On Jesus and the Church Today by Gerhard Lohfink. Is Jesus relevant for today? If you think not, don't bother with this book. But if you think that Jesus might have something to say to today's world, which Jesus comes to mind? Is he "gentle Jesus, meek and mild," offering individual salvation but with no message for a suffering world? Is he to be remembered as a Zealot fighting for a hopeless cause or as an outstanding rabbi? Was he a prophet in the long series of Israel's prophets or a religious founder like Muhammad or Gautama? Or was Jesus unique, a man utterly consumed by zeal for the reign of God, by the "fierce urgency of now?"
