FOR WHATEVER IS BORN OF GOD OVERCOMES THE WORLD; AND THIS IS THE VICTORY THAT OVERCOMES THE WORLD, OUR FAITH.

One of the key questions at this year's Central Diocesan Clergy Retreat was about the import of our faith in Jesus. Does believing in and following Jesus matter one bit beyond the couple of hours we spend at church each week?

This is an important question for us, both as clergy and as the entirety of God's people. We should be doing this self check each day - and I highly recommend it.

Another consideration offered by our retreat leader, Bishop Richard Lipka, is does our faith matter to anyone else. He put it very realistically: Does Governor so-and-so or President so-and-so ever pause one minute during their decision making process to consider what God says, what Scripture speaks, or what the people of God proclaim? Of course not.

We find ourselves faced with a world that wants us to give up hope, to just surrender. God says differently.

A couple of practical examples.

One person I met this summer explained the many challenges they are facing - health, financial, and

most importantly whether God really cares. Does my faith make any difference in my life? Is there reason for hope? As we spoke they reflected on all the people who are helping (generally people of faith) and how thankful they are. My response: You answered your own question. Those around you are sent by God, are a portion of the hope God offers. Yes, you have reason for hope.

A young person I encountered commented on how hopeless the world is, how it is a place where the loneliness of hopelessness predominates. That young person encountered people of faith and was transformed - both to faith in Jesus and to an attitude of hope.

Believing in and following Jesus matters greatly. It is transformative in individual lives and in the world. We offer something the world cannot offer - hope that is more powerful than anything we may face.

We have been born of God Who overcame for us. We have victory and overcome hopelessness in Him. Praise Him and share the hope.



Everyone is indeed welcome in God's House. Take time first to pray that God will bless our church with many who seek to know, love, and serve Him, then invite someone to join you.


This year's Back to Church Sunday theme is "HOPE HAPPENS HERE."

XXVI Holy Synod Please PRAY!

The upcoming Holy Synod is the fullest expression of our Church's ecclesial democracy. Our voice and vote will be represented by Fr. Jim and Joan Caska, your elected representative.

The XXVI Holy Synod of the Polish National Catholic Church will take place at the Scranton Hilton in Scranton, Pennsylvania from Wednesday, October 19th through Friday, October 21st. On Saturday, October 22nd, we will gather to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the Organization of our Holy Church.

This Synod is key because we have one bishop retiring who needs to be replaced. A successor must be chosen. We had planned to elect two candidates to be bishop, but all who were nominated have sadly declined. Nominations for bishop, as usual, will also be taken from the floor. **WE NEED PRAYER TO**

REMEDY THIS URGENT
SITUATION. Pray that worthy,
holy, and humble men, loyal to God

and His Holy Church, step up.

The Holy Synod will also work to build on what was accomplished at the past two Synods. At those Synods we developed and continued a general plan of action in five areas of focus: 1) Growth and Membership, 2) Increase Spirituality, 3) Lifelong Learning, 4) Sacred Vocations and 5) Community Involvement and Presence.

At each Synod the membership of National Commissions is set for the following four year period. These names come from volunteer Synod delegates. Although it is often only Synod delegates who become members of these Commissions, this is not required. Anyone who is interested in working to help the Church on a Synodal Commission may submit their name. Those submissions will be evaluated by the Prime Bishop and then presentation will be made to the General Synod. The list of National Commissions is: 1) Constitution, 2) Mission and Evangelism, 3) Budget and Finance, 4) School of Christian Living, 5) Liturgy, 6) Church Doctrine, 7) Clergy Salary and Benefits, 8) History and Archives and 9) Sacred Vocations.

Please consider if your talents may help the Church in serving on one of these Commissions. You may contact the Office of the Prime Bishop at 1006 Pittston Ave, Scranton, PA 18505 in writing should you wish to volunteer.

Please pray for the Holy Synod, for

the bishops and all the clergy, and for all lay delegates. There is much



important work that needs to be done as we chart a way forward to continue to build up the Kingdom of God with our Polish National Catholic Church. Pray the following each day through

October 21st:

Let us pray: O Holy Spirit, as the moments of Holy Synod approach, inspire and enlighten our bishops, clergy and delegates. As You descended upon our Lord Jesus Christ at the moment of His baptism, descend once again upon His body, the Church. In the preparations that will take place and in the proceedings that will occur, let all gathered in Holy Synod, listen to Him Who is our Lord. We ask this through the same Jesus Christ, Who lives and reigns with the Father and the same Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

September 2022 Discipleship – The Eucharist in the Declaration of Scranton

During the month of September as we continue our focus of Being Eucharistic People – we take some time to reflect on the important teaching of Church on the Holy Eucharist as found in paragraph 6 of the Declaration of Scranton.

Scripture: Acts 2:46-47

Reflection: The Declaration of Scranton formulated and accepted

by the P.N.C.C. Bishops on April 28, 2008 and later accepted by the Clergy Conference and the General Synod, helps guide the Church in its relationships with other Christian bodies. The document has allowed



us to enter into fruitful and real ecclesial relations with the Nordic Catholic Church in Scandinavia and the rest of Europe. The largest and most

vital paragraph of this document speaks to our faith in the Holy Eucharist and the celebration of Mass, which must be a part of any agreement that we have between Churches.

Action Item – Read the Eucharistic (6th) paragraph of the Declaration of Scranton (see shorturl.at/bhLN7) as well as the Scripture quotes cited. Spend some time at Holy Mass reflecting on what actually occurs when we gather to worship God and receive His Son in Holy Communion


