Perhaps some of us were moved to more deeply explore those gifts, to see where they were active in our lives and the life of our parish and wider Church. And yes, the Holy Spirit has been busy while we reflected! Never doubt that.

We have been granted wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. Of course we should give thanks, but more-so we should be active in setting those gifts to work in our lives, in the life of our parish, and in the wider Church.

Jesus wants us to rightly use the gifts we possess and make ourselves visible in doing His work in the world. No worry about tomorrow. Decide to put the Spirit's sevenfold gifts to work today and urgently work so that all their qualities shine from us as we show Jesus to the world.

XXVI HOLY SYNOD THIS MONTH Please PRAY!

This month's Holy Synod is the fullest expression of our Church's ecclesial democracy. Our voice and vote will be represented by Fr. Jim and Joan Caska, your elected representative.

Did you know that the Synod is not just a three/four day event. The Synod is active for the next four years and is expressed through the working of the Supreme Council of the Church.

The XXVI Holy Synod of the Polish National Catholic Church will take place at the Scranton Hilton in Scranton, Pennsylvania from Tuesday, October 18th through Friday, October 21st. On Saturday, October 22nd, we will gather to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the Organization of our Holy Church.



This Synod is key because we have one bishop retiring who needs to be replaced. A successor must be chosen. We had planned to elect two candidates to be bishop, but all who were nominated have sadly declined. Nominations for bishop, as usual, will also be taken from the floor. WE NEED PRAYER TO REMEDY THIS URGENT SITUATION. Pray that worthy, holy, and humble men, loyal to God and His Holy Church, step up.

The Holy Synod will also work to build on what was accomplished at

the past two Synods. At those Synods we developed and continued a general plan of action in five areas of focus: 1) Growth and Membership, 2) Increase Spirituality, 3) Lifelong Learning, 4) Sacred Vocations and 5) Community Involvement and Presence.

At each Synod the membership of National Commissions is set for the following four year period. These names come from volunteer Synod delegates. Although it is often only Synod delegates who become members of these Commissions, this is not required. Anyone who is interested in working to help the Church on a Synodal Commission may submit their name. Those submissions will be evaluated by the Prime Bishop and then presentation will be made to the General Synod. The list of National Commissions is: 1) Constitution, 2) Mission and Evangelism, 3) Budget and Finance, 4) School of Christian Living, 5) Liturgy, 6) Church Doctrine, 7) Clergy Salary and Benefits, 8) History and Archives and 9) Sacred Vocations.

Please consider if your talents may help the Church in serving on one of these Commissions. You may contact the Office of the Prime Bishop at 1006 Pittston Ave, Scranton, PA 18505 in writing should you wish to volunteer.

Please pray for the Holy Synod, for the bishops and all the clergy, and for all lay delegates. There is much

important work that needs to be

done as we chart a way forward to continue to build up the Kingdom of God with our Polish National Catholic Church. Pray the following each day through October 21st:

Let us pray: O Holy Spirit, as the moments of Holy Synod approach, inspire and enlighten our bishops, clergy and delegates. As You descended upon our Lord Jesus Christ at the moment of His baptism, descend once again upon His body, the Church. In the preparations that will take place and in the proceedings that will occur, let all gathered in Holy Synod, listen to Him Who is our Lord. We ask this through the same Jesus Christ, Who lives and reigns with the Father and the same Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

October Discipleship - St. Clare of Assisi



Scripture: Philippians 3:8-14, Matthew 19:27-29

Reflection: St. Clare of Assisi, whose Commemoration is August 11, came from a wealthy family which was

devoted to our Lord within the Church. Tradition tells us that, after hearing St. Francis preach, she felt God's call to follow Jesus in a way similar to Francis and embrace a life of detached poverty, simplicity, chastity, and prayer. Her family was against this, but she firmly held onto the call of the Holy Spirit and pursued this vocation along with other women whose leader and example she became to the point that they referred to her as "alter Franciscus," "another Francis."

When St. Claire's life became challenging or overwhelming, when she grew tired or even afraid, she ran into the arms of Christ in the Eucharist. In this way, she is a wonderful example to all of us as disciples of Jesus, Whenever the unique pathway of discipleship that God has set out in front of each us becomes rocky or ridden with holes, and we feel like we can go no further and might even like to give up, we can go to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and receive our strength. St. Clare, pray for us!

Action Item: Here is St. Clare's Prayer to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist: "*I come, O Lord, unto Thy sanctuary to see the life*

and food of my soul. As I hope in Thee, O Lord, inspire me with that confidence which brings me to Thy holy mountain. Permit me, Divine Jesus, to come closer to Thee, that my whole soul may do homage to the greatness of Thy majesty; that my heart, with its tenderest affections, may acknowledge Thine infinite love; that my memory may dwell on the admirable mysteries here renewed every day, and that the sacrifice of my whole being may accompany Thine."

Every weekend this month, get to Mass early or stay a while after Mass and pray it to our Lord Whose true and abiding presence is in the tabernacles of our churches.

Schedule: October is also the month of the Holy Rosary. We will pray the Rosary in the presence of the Most Blessed Sacrament on Wednesday. October 5th, 12th, and 26th at 3pm.
