he text above is from Hebrews 11:7, wherein the writer is reminding people who knew the Hebrew Scriptures, of Noah's faithfulness to God's instruction and the fact that by being faithful he became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

This year, the Pre-Lenten season begins right on the first Sunday in February, and by the time this twoand-a-half week season passes on we are in Lent. It will go by quickly.

This year, let us liken ourselves to Noah. We all know the account found in Genesis Chapter 5 - 9.

Scripture says that Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation and that he walked with God. While this was true of Noah, and because of Noah was also true in his family, the rest of the world was corrupt, violent, and filled with continuous evil (sound familiar?).

The question to ask - Am I faithful like Noah, and how will my faithfulness affect this age?


Noah certainly did not know what to

do with the corruption of his time. While he acted properly, was righteous and blameless, he made no impact on those around him. God had to intervene to change the situation. For us, we live in the light of God's greatest intervention. Not the flood, but the sending of His Son Jesus. That means we now know what to do and we have the power to do it (no flood needed).

Jesus showed us the way to go. He gave us the gospel that is life. He enjoined on us the Beatitudes as a way of life along with all the other instruction from the Sermon on the Mount. If we do as Jesus taught, we will deeply impact our time, culture, and the people around us. As with the early Christians, people will be amazed and enter the kingdom.

Like Noah, let us use this time to prepare, to grow in faithfulness, to build a way of life consistent with the gospel. Where we have succeeded, let us build further. Where we have fallen short, let us prepare to fix it now, and fix it this Lent.

of the liturgical season of Lent.
Septuagesima includes three
Sundays, Septuagesima Sunday (70

Sunday (60 days to Easter), and
Quinquagesima Sunday (50 days to
Easter). We are called to make a
special point of self-examination, of
considering the things we need to
repent of and clean out.

A special collection was accepted on January 29th to benefit the National United Choir's Music Scholarship Fund. These scholarships are available to any



Coming to Grips with the Real You

"Who do you think you are?

This is not an easy question for most of us to answer. But it is a question that we're all unconsciously asking, and it's one that we will grapple with all the days of our lives.

That's because most of us struggle with seeing ourselves accurately. Some of us don't know who we are and, if the truth is known, we might admit that we don't like who we are either. Then there are some of us who see ourselves as better than others, and there are some of us who struggle with feeling inadequate, constantly seeking the approval of others.

I'm convinced that the extent to which we're able to accurately see ourselves affects not only our relationships but also the contentment in our lives. And as Christians, this is even more important.

In order to discover God's unique purpose for each of our lives, we must learn how to see ourselves for who we really are — not who we want to be or who we think we are.

This question is not a new one. In fact, the Apostle Paul addresses this very issue in his letter to the Romans. He instructed them to first get an accurate self-assessment. He wrote, "Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment." (Rom. 12:3)

Having "sober judgment" means that we see ourselves neither too highly or too lowly. It also means we need to know both our strengths and weaknesses. It requires taking an honest look at how our family backgrounds, environment, significant others, personalities, and values shape the ways we think about ourselves.

Remember Moses? He had quite the journey trying to figure out who he was. We read in Ex. 2-4 that over the course of Moses' life he had to come to terms with his warped view of himself – first it was too high and then it was too low. When God called him to lead God's people out of slavery in Egypt, he put up quite a protest and begged God not to send him.

But God knew Moses was the perfect person for the job. He used Moses'

desires to help the Israelites, as well as his background, education and all of his experiences growing up in Pharaoh's house as the needed preparation to fulfill His divine design for Moses' life.

So how can we begin to come to grips with our true self? Here are a few ways to get started:

- Ask God to help you recognize the warped mirrors of the world that have helped shape an inaccurate view of yourself.
- 2. Get God's view of yourself through reading His word. Focus on the passages that specifically talk about how God sees you as his beloved son/daughter.
- 3. Talk to others. Ask one or two trusted friends to help you see yourself the way they see you.
- 4. Discover your primary spiritual gift.
- 5. Celebrate daily that you are unique, loved, accepted and being prepared to fulfill your divine assignment.

No one can give a more accurate view of your life than God. You're His tapestry — a work of art! God created you uniquely. There is no one else in the universe with DNA like yours. And He wants to use everything in your past and all of who you are in the present to accomplish His divine assignment for your life! "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Eph 2:10).
