THE GLORY THAT YOU HAVE GIVEN ME I HAVE GIVEN TO THEM, THAT THEY MAY BE ONE EVEN AS WE ARE ONE,

The short excerpt above is from John 17:22, part of the Last Supper narrative between Jesus and His disciples, near the end of it.

Whereas in the other three gospels Jesus actually eats a passover meal before He dies, in John's gospel He doesn't. The Last Supper is actually eaten before the beginning of Passover. So, the sequence of events leading up to the actual crucifixion are very different in John's gospel.

John's gospel account records Jesus' extended teaching (see John 13– 17). Although John does not retell Jesus giving the bread and the cup and instituting the New Covenant in His blood, the symbols and words used in the Lord's Supper are abundant in John's Gospel.

While Jesus does not mention the new covenant in His blood in John, He does give the new commandment centered in that covenant (John 13:34), "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another." Jesus' teaching in this narrative are instructive to us as we move through our lives. As on Palm Sunday for Jesus, we experience times of glory and triumph. As on Maundy Thursday evening, we experience times of fellowship and bonding. As on that night and Good Friday we experience times of great sorrow and seeming defeat.

Because Jesus fully understood and experienced our human condition, our joys, fellowship, pain and sadness, He wanted us to know what we have in Him.

Easter reminds us of the glory Jesus' Father gave Him which He has now given us. This not just for the sake of having God's glory, but so we may be one in that glory.

Easter reminds us of our new life in Jesus. It reminds us as our status as family to God and each other. We have an opportunity each day to live in this new life, so we see even our sufferings and trials in a much different way. They are not permanent. God's love and life and our fellowship in Him overcomes even death forever. Happy Easter!

How to say Happy Easter

The Paschal greeting is an Easter custom among Christians. Instead of saying "hello," "good morning," or some other greeting we are to greet each other with "Christ is Risen!" The proper response is "Truly, He is Risen." Here is the Pascal greeting in several languages:

- English: Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!
- Spanish: *iCristo ha resucitado! iEn verdad ha resucitado!*
- Italian: Cristo è risorto! È veramente risorto!
- Polish: Chrystus zmartwychwstał! Prawdziwie zmartwychwstał!
- •Swahili Kristo Amefufukka! Kweli Amefufukka!
- •German: Christus ist auferstanden! Er ist wahrhaftig auferstanden!
- •Norwegian: *Kristus er oppstanden! Han er sannelig oppstanden!*
- •Rastafarian Krestos a uprisin! Seen, him a uprisin fe tru!
- French: Christ est ressuscité! Il est vraiment ressuscité!
- Greek: Χριστός ἀνέστη! Ἀληθῶς ανέστη!
- •Ukrainian: Христос воскрес! Воістину воскрес!
- •Gaelic: Tá Críost éirithe! Go deimhin, tá sé éirithe!
- •Scottish: Tha Crìosd air èiridh! Gu dearbh, tha e air èiridh!
