AND THE LORD OPENED THE MOUTH OF THE ASS, AND SHE SAID UNTO BALAAM, WHAT HAVE I DONE UNTO THEE, THAT THOU HAST SMITTEN ME

Balaam's ass is one of two animals in the Bible that can speak. She is also one of two who are a blessing to their human companions. I encourage you to read the whole story found in Numbers, Chapters 22 through 24. This story has much to tell us about our walk of faith.

Baalam was a soothsayer or magician. The King of the Moabites had called on Balaam to curse Israel who were coming out of Egypt into his land. At first Balaam would not go, listening to God, but later relented under much pressure. All along God tells Balaam not to go, but he later chooses to go, agreeing to say only what God tells him.

Along the journey Balaam's ass bows humbly and will go no further. Balaam beats the animal three times. Finally the ass speaks and asks Balaam why he has hit her. He gets angrier and tells her he would kill her. Then God opens Balaam's eyes and he sees the Angel of the Lord with sword drawn standing in the road. The angel tells Balaam: *Wherefore hast thou smitten thine* ass? behold, I went out to withstand thee, because thy way is perverse before me: And the ass saw me, and turned from me these three times: unless she had turned from me, surely now also I had slain thee, and saved her alive.

This is a story of faithfulness and of weakened faith. The Angel (of course) and the ass are absolutely faithful to God, and in terms of the ass, to Balaam. This loyalty failed in Balaam. He chose to neglect God's command, preferring to try making a deal with God so he could please the King of the Moabites. He also chose to hit his animal.

Balaam's disloyalty causes God to show that He is the One in charge. He can send angels and cause animals to speak. Balaam (and we) are reminded that we must follow God's instruction. We cannot double-deal. We cannot bargain out of doing as God asks without consequences.

Our walk of faith is to be a life of loyalty to God's command, His Word Who is Jesus, the Holy Spirit's work in the Church. Let us not veer!

The Church Organ

If you hadn't noticed, there is a new organ in place in the back of the church.

Our original organ was purchased by the Harmonia Choir through their fundraisers in late 1951 for \$3,000. The old organ, which has been discarded, was a Baldwin Model 5. That organ was no longer serviceable and could not be properly played.



We had the opportunity to acquire an Allen Organ (Theater Type C) which was being donated to us. Thank you to the

team of Paul, Jeff, John Costello, and Fr. Jim who moved the new organ in. To what end? As you may know SUNY Schenectady has an organist program in its music Department. Fr. Jim has been in touch with them to arrange to have students play on an internship basis. We will also have the opportunity for concerts and fundraisers which will prayerfully draw people in.

Food Bank



We have partnered with the Regional Food Bank, Schenectady Foundation, and Nationally Touching Greatness to offer a food bank serving the Mont Pleasant neighborhood. Our first pop-up food bank was held on June 27th. We were able to serve many. We thank parish volunteers Meagan and Lauren for their help. Another event will be held in July and they will hopefully become more frequent.

Care Portal

Our community impact continues. Due to Alyssa's Easter Basket Fundraiser, funds were set aside that help fulfill needs. People from our wider community are connecting to donate items needed by families. These provide for a stable home environment for families who need them to stay together and safe.
