#### Welcome to October!

We see a wonderful theme for this month carried on from our celebration of Brotherly Love in September. It is this, a theme of deep focus on sacrificial love. Peter reminds us of our Christian duty to sacrificial love in 1 Peter 1:22 as quoted above: *love one another earnestly*. How do we grow in love?

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. We must ensure, of course, that we keep the rosary in perspective as a methodology for concentrated prayer and not as some sort of magical mystery thing.

The rosary takes us on a tour of the glorious, joyful, and sorrowful moments (called mysteries in the rosary) in the life of Jesus.

What we see in each moment of His life and that of Mary is their living out the sacrificial love that marks the gospel way of life. They give of themselves totally to do as God the Father asks. By their example and our focusing on that example, we discover new ways to share our love. We pause to recollect how we might imitate Jesus and follow His call to love as the Father asks.

Also in October we celebrate the Christian Family in a special way. The family, as designed by God, is the seed bed for developing a life that conforms to St. Peter's guidance - foremost by obedience to the truth.

The family relationship, the smaller model for the wider Church, is the place we learn true self-sacrifice, whether it is giving up our time or treasure to serve another member or in giving up our dreams to bring the aspirations of the other to fruition.

Further, the truth of God and our obedience to it is also self-sacrifice founded in love. No, we must not meander through life just doing whatever we please if we call ourselves Christian. We set aside our urges to do as we please in order to follow Jesus' way of life and the Father's call to us.

To love one another earnestly means we place our whole selves in the service of love. We privy ourselves by obedience to God's truth and with sincerity follow Jesus, imitate Mary, love on our families, and take a back seat to the other.

#### The Debacle in Poland

As noted in last month's newsletter, the former Polish 'Catholic' Church in Poland proceeded with phony consecrations of four priests. These men remain bishops elect and priests who no longer hold the faith.

The Bishops of the Polish National



Catholic Church in the United States and Canada have issued a letter to these priests outlining the consequences of their actions and the theater they carried out on September 9th. Simply put, we are no longer in unity with them.

This was the Church Bishop Hodur was arrested, beaten, and stoned for. This was the Church Bishop Padewski was martyred for. It is so sad.

Formally: As a consequence of this action by the Polish Catholic Church in the Republic of Poland:

- The clergy of the Polish Catholic Church may not celebrate the Eucharistic Sacrifice within Polish National Catholic parishes and the clergy of the Polish National Catholic Church may not celebrate within the parishes of the Polish Catholic Church.
- There is to be no concelebration of the Eucharist with clergy of the

Polish Catholic Church.

 Likewise, the members of the Polish National Catholic Church should not receive communion from priests of the Polish Catholic Church.

We [are] praying that the sisterly unity of our Churches will one day be restored.

What is truly amazing is that these men caved in to European zeitgeist and secularist themes, abandoning their catholicism very easily - without even a thought, without a whimper.

Herein the rub: Throughout history the Polish people have withstood Mongol invasion, political division, Communist and Nazi subjugation, and the murder of more than 6 million of its population. The Polish people were always known for their bravery in the face of conquerers, holding on to their language, identity, and particularly their faith. They resisted with courage. Yet this body was conquered without resistance. These four men are cowards and traitors to God, their faith, and their heritage.

As noted in last month's newsletter, these men told our bishops to keep their American opinions to themselves. This is an ironic statement since we do not have, as a Church, American opinions, rather we have catholic ones. These men ironically treasure European identity and opinions over catholic ones.

In the Union Canon we pray in unity

with holy Willibrord, who was "Apostle to the Frisians" in the modern Netherlands and the first bishop of Utrecht. May his intercession move these men and their body back to the catholic faith from whatevergoesonboard.

#### **PNUA Transitions of PNA**



The Polish
National Union of
America (PNUA)
- our Fraternal
Insurance
Company signed papers
along with the

leadership of the Polish National Alliance (PNA) affecting a merger effective October 1st. Both organizations' elected delegates unanimously approved the merger.

The PNUA is now a Division of the PNA. Our former District 10 is now a PNA Lodge within the Division.

Be rest assured, all PNUA insurance policies and annuities remain in effect but now as PNA policies and annuities. The transition only effects these financial securities. All Polish National Catholic members now have access to a wider array of insurance and annuity products as well as Lodge funding and educational scholarships.

What else has changed/not changed?

- Straż: As the PNUA no longer exists as a separate body it will no longer publish Straż. All members will receive Zgoda - the official publication of the PNA. The rights to Straż remain with the PNCC.
- PNUA Social Memberships no longer exist.
- The PNUA District of the PNA will continue its educational stipends, scholarships, and will support the wider PNCC.
- The Spójnia Credit Union (SCU) remains a separate organization.
   All members of the PNA now have access to the SCU.
- Spójnia Inc. remains a separate organization. The PNA has no rights to this organization or its assets.
- The Education and Youth Commission of the PNCC remain.
   The PNA has no rights to this commission or its assets.

There is much history between the PNCC, our parish, and the PNA. A lot of that history is positive while some is negative such as the weaponization of the PNA by certain people in an effort to destroy the PNCC. We must recognize that history to assure it is not repeated.

We live in a world that pulls us in a hundred directions simultaneously. Families take different forms. Families struggle to find time to share together. We barely eat together, watch the same television

programs, or even worship together. We have lost touch with the concept of a day of rest - a day on which we used to reconnect as family and community.

On the Solemnity of the Christian Family, October 8th, we offer our prayers to God for our families. And since these are prayers for the Christian Family, not only our individual families, we pray that all families make time for Christ and His Holy Church.

Please join together for worship on this special Solemnity and extend an invitation to members of your family.

#### **Month of All Souls**

As October passes the days grow shorter, the colors of autumn take hold, and our thoughts turn to the Commemoration of All Souls. The



Holy Church sets aside the month of November to commemorate those who have preceded us in holy death.

known as "wypominki."

of the Polish National Catholic Church may be buried in these cemeteries.
