"ANXIETY WEIGHS DOWN THE HEART, BUT A KIND WORD CHEERS IT UP."

The text above is from Proverbs 12:25. The proverbs of King Solomon begin by stating their purpose: for gaining wisdom and instruction; understanding words of insight; receiving instruction in prudent behavior, doing what is right, just, and fair; giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young— let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance— The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

We all need this kind of learning and insight, especially when confronted by the anxieties of our time. When we look at the world and all its conflict, or perhaps even in our own hearts, how can we possibly be cheerful. Well, Proverbs tells us - by a kind word.

Spring is well underway, Summer around the corner - yet what surrounds us can still choke the air with anxieties.

As this is leap year, we will soon be (and already are in) the midst of political conflict, bickering, election

noise, and nastiness on all sides. As such, I ask you to realize the anxiety that rises in us and offer a solution that will work for our own hearts. It is God's advice.

With anxiety's heaviness, kindness is a powerful counter-balance. This is more than just a feel-good sentiment. It's a call to action, reminding us of the profound impact we can have on ourselves and others. We have the opportunity to be light-bearers, to offer kind words that uplift, cheer, and heal.

As we extend kindness, we ourselves often experience a lightness too. Kindness multiplies, spreading light to both the giver and the receiver. Then, as this year goes on, let's take this Proverb to heart. Let's seek those moments to speak a kind word. We never know the impact a single word of kindness can have – it might just be the very thing that lightens someone's load.

Lord, In a world filled with so much anxiety, help me to be a source of light, using my voice to uplift and cheer the hearts around me, just as You do for me every day.

The Angelus?



Did you know that church bells ring in a special way at 9am, noon, and 6pm? The Angelus bell is rung to remind us of our call

to pray the Angelus.

The Angelus is a devotion commemorating the Incarnation of Jesus. The devotion is the recitation of three verses and responses from the Bible and praying the Hail Mary in between.

During most seasons of the year the Angelus goes as follows:

- V. The Angel of the LORD declared unto Mary
- R. And she conceived of the Holy Ghost.

Hail Mary...

- y. Behold the handmaid of the LORD.
- R. Be it done unto me according to thy word.

Hail Mary...

V. And the Word was made flesh.

R. And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary...

- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Amen.

During the Easter Season, these words are replaced by Queen of Heaven

- R. The Son you merited to bear, alleluia,
- v. Has risen as he said, alleluia.
- R. Pray to God for us, alleluia.
- R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

Let us pray: O God, who have been pleased to gladden the world by the Resurrection of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that through his Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may receive the joys of everlasting life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

In offering these prayers we bind ourselves closely with Mary asking that she intercede for us.

Food Bank News



We received some sad news. Mr. Delvern Cooper who had been running occasional food bank opportunities and Toys for Tots distributions at the parish died unexpectedly on March 22nd. We grieve for his wife children, and entire family. Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord!

There is still a great need for a food bank in Mont Pleasant. To that end Fr. Jim has been meeting with representatives from the Daily Bread Food Panty at St. Luke's on State Street, Sycamore Collaborative (formerly SiCM), the Northeast Regional Food Bank, the Schenectady City Council, and others to discuss making this possible at our location.

As you might imagine, resources get stretched thin, and no one organization can 'go it alone.' To that end we are collaborating together, with the concurrence of the Parish Committee, to get this going.

The tentative plan is to have a weekly food bank satellite location at the parish beginning toward the end of June. It would likely be held Mondays from 3 until 5pm.



Season of Mysteries

In the month of May we conclude the 50 day Easter Season with the celebration of Pentecost on May 19th. The following Sunday (May 26th) is Trinity Sunday in which we encounter the Mystery of the Holy Trinity. The following Thursday (May 30th) we celebrate Corpus Christi - the Mystery of the Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior which we receive at Holy Mass. NO, it is not a symbol or a representation - it is His Body and Blood. The Sunday following the completion of the Corpus Christ Octave (June 9th) is a new Solemnity established in our Holy Church - that of the Word of God.

Encountering these Mysteries (the Trinity, Body and Blood, and Word) help us to recognize the great love of God Who shows Himself forth in relationship, presence, and word for our upbuilding. We do not have to understand the how's and why's of these Mysteries, just to accept them in faith and with great joy.

The Altamont Fair

Our parish was able to secure sponsorship of the Chapel at the Altamont Fair (August 13—18). The Chapel was built in 1973 to fill the religious needs of the many traveling people and carnival workers. Almost all of the furnishings in the chapel were donated by individuals and churches.
