s the new year begins it behoves us to take account of our lives.

Certainly, there is personal stuff we should address. It may be our weight, health issues, and so on. Our concerns also extend to our families - am I spending enough time and paying attention to their needs. This includes the parish family and its needs as well.

All of these concerns add up, don't they? They become a sort of whirlwind which appears impossible. How do I succeed?

Recently, I attended a class given by a former Marine pilot who had served in Iraq. His duty station was the Al-Anbar province. This was the worst place on earth. It was so bad that most, including American commanders, wrote it off as unsalvageable and unwindable; there was no way out.

The overall campaign took four years. 1,335 Americans were killed, 8,205 injured.

When one faces a significant challenge as the U.S. did in Al-Anbar, or even our own personal whirlwinds, we need to search deeply for keys to success.

In the end Al-Anbar became a success for its people because leaders took initiative to succeed. But, who were those leaders?

It is not as many suspect, a few top people, but rather a wholesale change in dynamic - the key -<u>everyone</u> had to be a leader.

For our Church and for our parish let us take these lessons to heart. Each of us is called to be a leader in every situation. Each of us is called to learn leadership - because it is a learned trait, not just something that happens (and we will focus on that in the year ahead).

The first key is to recognize and focus on our why. If our why is focused inwardly, if all is about me, we will be unhappy and fail; we will miss on the commandment of love. If our why is focused on others, on our fellow parishioners, church members, and community we can be anywhere, in any role, and be truly happy. Let us then take on leadership in this new year and so overcome the whirlwind with victory.

2025 marks the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea held in 325.

The Church, faced with mounting heresy against the identity of

Jesus, came together to not just condemn the heresies, but to also set forth the Symbol of Faith, the Holy Creed which we recite at every Holy Mass. The Creed joins us together with all orthodox Christians in a declaration of what we believe.

The Creed, established at Nicaea has been kept in-tact by our Holy Church as well as the Orthodox Churches since 325. That is 1700 years of consistency in our belief.

Throughout 2025 we will be celebrating the Creed. The Church will hold special events marking the occasion and providing teaching on the Creed. Stay tuned for these excellent events in celebration of the Symbol of Faith.

Seminarians, Seminary, AND YOUR HELP

We have been regularly praying for the gift of vocations and God is answering our pleas. We have six men in formation for the priesthood and several on track for entry into the Savonarola Theological Seminary. Others regularly contact Fr. Jim, who is the National Vocations Director, seeking information. This is indeed a great blessing and we should give thanks.

As you may be aware, the seminary building was in significant need to updating and repair. Pipes were leaking, the restrooms and showers were unusable, the furnace/boiler dating to 1968 is shot, old cast iron stack pipes needed replacement.

We have undertaken these projects in a phased approach.

The YMSofR Central Committee put together a team to clean out the seminary. Thank you to Nick K, Nick C., Kevin, Jeremy, and the Stankowski men for your hard work.

In the weeks and month ahead the library will be re-cataloged, the plumbing fixed, the bathroom and shower redone, and the boiler replaced.

Other YMSofR branches and parishes have reached out to help through fundraisers and financial donations, as well as in-kind work. We foresee parishes and dioceses who will benefit from having these men in ministry also stepping up to help.
