AS IN WATER FACE REFLECTS FACE, SO THE HEART OF MAN REFLECTS THE MAN.

Many passages in Scripture discuss our outward bearing, our words, the way we treat others as a reflection of what is within us.

Is that a sorry prospect for us? Is our first instinct to work on covering up and over those things that are not so pleasant?

If that is our instinct, and if we are truthful, we quickly realize that covering up isn't going to work. Remember our parents telling us that lies only compound lies. If we are old enough to remember the Watergate scandal, we may recall one of the lessons learned: The coverup is often worse than the crime.

It is daunting to recognize the brokenness we may have, taking account of those things that are not so good, how they seep out of us in words and actions, and how they turn our thoughts to evil things.

Thankfully there is a whole bunch of medicine offered this June.

There is of course the gifts we receive from the Holy Spirit celebrated on Pentecost -

particularly Wisdom and Understanding that help us recognize what is broken and commit to all need to heal.

On Trinity Sunday we see the relationship of the Father, Son, and Spirit and aspire to the mutual love They have.

In the Holy Eucharist celebrated in the Octave of Corpus Christi we draw close to Jesus and take Him into ourselves - He Who is the source of all healing and love.

On The Solemnity of the Word we ascent to God's Word given to us, to walking the way Jesus showed we must walk. There we find ideal compliance with God's way of life.

Throughout the month we most particularly focus on Jesus' Sacred Heart. His heart is the model for ours. His outpouring is the manner by which we are healed.

As His blood and water was poured out for the sake of love and healing, let us set to work on carrying the image of His heart stamped on our hearts so that His heart in us shines forth in our outward bearing.

They loose their housing and all the other benefits they had as active clergy and must venture out to live on that meager amount. They sacrificed their lives for their flock, must they sacrifice again? Should the priest die, the widow is left with \$300 a month. A shame!

The Solemnity and Octave of Corpus Christi

On June 19th we will celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Body of Christ at the Annual Men's Retreat.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a religious manifestation and confession of our Eucharistic faith. By the presence and active participation in the liturgy Catholics publicly profess their faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This is a time when Catholics show their love for Christ by honoring Him in a public way and show their love for their neighbors by bringing the Lord and Savior closer to them.


The Solemnity of Corpus Christi has been solemnly celebrated in parishes of the Polish National Catholic Church since her organization. Its complete celebration lasts for eight days, an Octave.

A New Solemnity

Word of God Sunday is our newest solemnity in the PNCC, and will be celebrated this year on June 29th. It is designed in our Church to be observed the Sunday after Corpus Christi Sunday. The liturgical color is white, and the readings are found in the PNCC ordo (liturgical calendar). The Word of God Sunday is a very important occasion for us, because

of the uniqueness of the Word of God as Sacrament in the PNCC. May we give thanks and praise to God for His Many Blessings!

The Sacred Heart



Christ's Sacred Heart of love is expressed most profoundly in the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist. Jesus' giving of Himself, is celebrated joyously on Corpus Christi and in its Octave. At the end of the Octave we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Devotion to the Eucharist and to the Sacred Heart are as inseparable as devotion is to the mystery of

Christ's human and Divine love. In the Sacred Host dwells the Godman, Jesus; in His Person pulses His Heart of flesh through which we are loved with the perfection of His humanity, the fullness of His Godhead, one Person who not only loves but is Love.

Let us use the month of June to get acquainted or re-acquainted with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. You'll be glad you did!

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of our piety for Christ. It calls us to conversion, love, gratitude, and dedication to Christ and His saving work.

There are two things that should meet in devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

You can find a Litany to the Sacred Heart in your PNCC Prayerbook on page 123. Join us on Wednesday, June 4th, 11th, and 25th for Sacred Heart devotions at noon.

Almighty and eternal God, look upon the Heart of Thy Most beloved Son, and upon the praise and satisfaction He offers Thee on behalf of sinners, and when they come to Thee imploring Thy mercy, graciously pardon them, in the name of Thy Son Jesus Christ, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.
